What are Endangered Animals?

How are endangered animals protected?

Many countries all over the world have (3) laws that protect endangered animals. It is often a crime to kill or injure an endangered or protected animal. In the United States there are a lot of laws that protect endangered animals. These laws are part of the Endangered Species Act which was signed into law by President Nixon in 1973. These laws help protect the animals and their habitat. They also have some programs to help animals grow.

In the world there are also (4) wildlife or nature preserves. These preserves are large areas of land where animals and their habitat are protected. Development is very limited or not accepted on the lands. We also cannot do hunting freely. Critically endangered animals are often protected by keeping some of them in a particular place and taking care of them there. This helps scientist to save the species and also helps them to study the animals.

Scientists also study the animals in the wild to understand why their population is getting smaller. With good science, scientists may be able to help a species of animal survive extinction.
