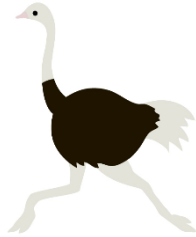

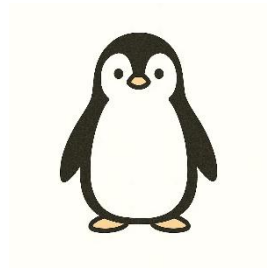

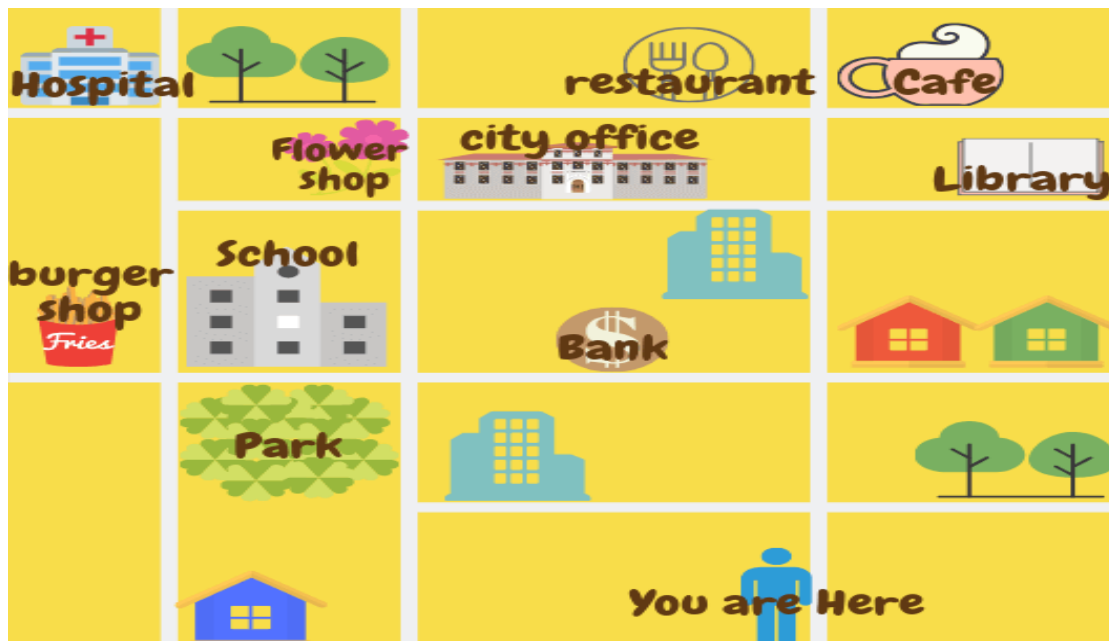

Ken: Hey, Yuki. You look sleepy again. Did you stay up late last night?

Yuki: Yeah. I was studying and also watching videos on my phone.

Ken: I do that, too. How many hours did you sleep?

Yuki: About five, maybe less.

Ken: Wow. I read a report in the newspaper this morning. It said that many Japanese adults don't get enough sleep like you.

Yuki: Really?

Ken: Yes. The report says that in the "20 years and older" group, around 37.5 % of men and 40.6 % of women sleep less than six hours. That means almost half of adults don't sleep enough.

Yuki: That's a lot of people. Why do so many people get so little sleep?

Ken: The report says that many people work or study for too long, and that they often use their smartphones at night.

Yuki: I know. I am like that, too. My father also says, "(①) is important," but he often comes home after midnight.

Ken: She wakes up early and says she sleeps only five hours.

Yuki: Not enough sleep is bad for our health, right?

Ken: Yes. The report also says that sleep is like food for the brain: during sleep, our brain keeps memories and ideas.

Yuki: Sleeping well helps us think better.

Ken: Exactly. When I don't sleep enough at night, I feel sleepy at school.

Yuki: That's true. I fell asleep in some classes today.

Ken: In some countries, people take ②naps after lunch to refresh.

Yuki: That sounds nice. However, Japanese people may feel (③) about resting.

Ken: Yes. The report also says that the number of Japanese people who say they don't sleep enough is increasing.

Yuki: I hope our society changes someday.

Ken: Me, too. If people sleep well and rest, maybe they will live healthier and happier lives.

When we watch movies, we usually enjoy the story, the characters, or the animation. However, movies can be more interesting if we pay attention (A) screen movement and the position of the characters. Some people think these things may not be important, but ①they help us understand the story and the feelings of the characters better. When we know the meaning of these movements and positions, movies can tell us stronger and more exciting stories.

There are six basic types of screen movement. They are from top to bottom, from bottom to top, from right to left, from left to right, from front to back, and ②the other way. Each movement has a different meaning. (B) example, movement from bottom to top usually gives a good feeling. It can show hope, success, or strength. (C), movement from top to bottom often gives a bad feeling. It can show fear, danger, or sadness.

Front-and-back movement is also important. When the screen moves from front to back, it often shows the future or something lucky. It may mean that something new will begin. However, when the screen moves from back to front, it often shows the (D) or something unlucky. This movement can make the audience feel worried or nervous.

Left-and-right movement also has meaning. In Western culture, people usually think time moves from left to right. Writing and video games, such as Super Mario Bros., follow this idea. Because of ③this, movement from left to right feels (E). It often shows daily life or good actions. However, movement from right to left can feel strange or unclear. It may show something in the past or something bad might happen.

The position of characters on the screen is just (F) important (G) screen movement. *Harry Potter* is a good example of this. Harry is the brave main character in this movie and Voldemort is a man who killed Harry's parents. Characters shown on the right side are often (H) characters. Characters shown on the left side are often (I) characters. Up-and-down positions have similar meanings. When characters are shown higher on the screen, it means they are good. When characters are shown lower, it means they are bad. In the final scene of *Harry Potter*, Harry is shown in the (J) right, while Voldemort is shown in the (K) left.

Finally, screen movement and character position *affect how we feel when we are watching a movie. By thinking about these points, we can enjoy movies in a deeper and more interesting way.

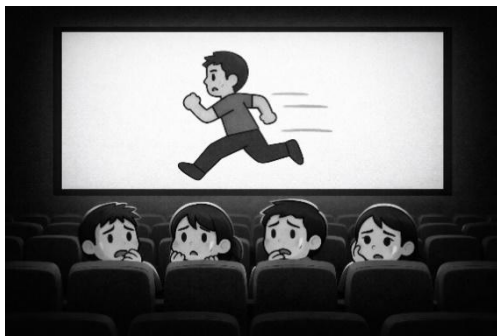

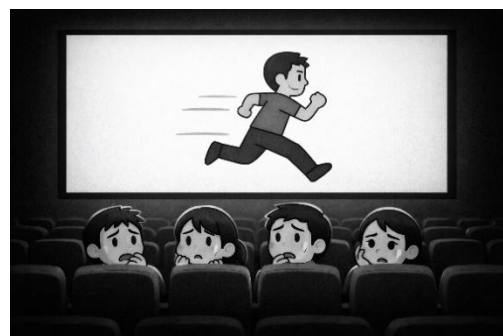

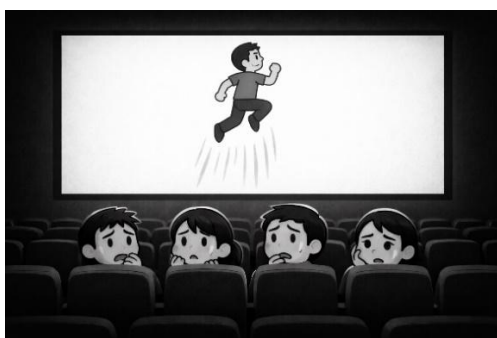
